We'll be having some drills in the next week or two that will include a fire drill with some of our exit routes blocked to simulate what might occur in a real fire. We'll also be having a lockdown drill. There is only one set of front doors to lock to make sure our building is completely locked down and I reviewed with our student body what we do in case we have a lockdown. Mr. Laney has been going to different classrooms and sharing information about earthquake/tsunami safety and we will be having a drill in the near future for that as well. While we all hope that we never have a real emergency, we want to be as prepared as possible to keep everyone safe. The morning assembly time is also a good way to practice listening as a whole school. No matter what emergency we might have to deal with in the future, last minute decisions are almost always made and the ability to listen to adults in a large group is an important part of handling a challenging situation. School Closures or Delayed Starts

Coos Bay Public Schools will utilize the Synvoice automated phone system to notify families of school closures, delayed starts and other emergencies.



In the event of a closure or delayed start, the automated system will be activated, usually by 6:00 am, and all families will be called and given the message. Included in the message will be a phone number that you can call to get a recorded update. **Please be sure your contact information is correct at the schools.**

The information will also be sent out via Flash Alert to the media and posted on the district's website at www.cbd9.net. If you would like to receive Flash Alert notification, go to www.flashalert.net/news.html?id=1374. At that site, you can sign up to receive both text messages and e-mails for emergency alerts and news releases.
