Counseling Corner

Today I want to share what I feel is the most important way parents can support their children to make good grades and do well in school. Good attendance is the key to success in school. When a student misses a day they come back trying to catch up with the other students. If they are motivated learners, they will ask the teacher for work or will do the extra work they missed when the teacher gives it to them. Unfortunately not all students are motivated learners and they feel they don't need to make up their work and so they start to fall behind.

Some students miss several days of school a month and it really effects their grades and their self-esteem. They think they are not smart because they don't understand something and the real truth is, if they had been in school every day they would have gotten the information they needed. Please help your child to understand that coming to school every day is very important and don't keep them home unless they are ill.
