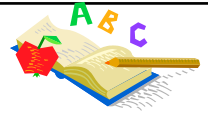

### A Note from the Nurse:

I hope everyone is having a great start to the school year. I just want to give you a few reminders about medications at school.

There is a form that must be completed before the medicine can be given. There has to be a signed permission form completed every school year. Also it is school district policy that medications are disposed of at the end of the school year.
