Counseling Corner

So parents, I hope some of you have started important conversations using the questions in the last few newsletters. It is amazing the answers you get when you ask an open ended question. Hopefully, you spend time having discussions about many things with your children. In this busy world we live in it isn't always easy to find the time, but it can open so many doors in the future and it is the best way to let your children know how important they are to you.

Today we had an assembly presented by our Student Resource Officer, Mark Wheeling about the Student Code of Conduct pertaining to harassment, bullying and cyberbullying. The Coos Bay School District 9 defines "Cyberbullying" as the use of any electronic communication device to convey a message in any form (text, image, audio or video) that intimidates, harasses or is otherwise intended to harm, insult or humiliate another in a deliberate, repeated or hostile and unwanted manner under a person's true or false identity.

Many of our students are out there on cyberspace and need to be aware of how serious this policy is and how harmful it is to hurt others in this way. Please discuss the use of cell phones and computers with your child and talk to them about what they learned today.
