Counseling Corner

In the last few weeks, I presented a lesson to the 5th and 6th graders about bullying and harassment. Students were reminded of the definition of Bullying: "Conduct that is unfair and one-sided. It happens when someone keeps hurting, frightening, threatening, or leaving someone out on purpose." They also have learned that a Conflict is: "A disagreement that happens when people want different things. The people involved in a conflict have equal power to solve the problem."

We also discussed the definition of Harassment, which includes "Acts which subjects an individual or group to unwanted, abusive behavior of a nonverbal, verbal, written or physical nature on the basis of age, race, religion, color, national origin, disability or sexual orientation."

We went over the Student Code of Conduct that they are responsible for knowing, their responsibilities while on campus, at school-related activities and while being transported to and from school or school-sponsored activities. The Code also includes the consequences when the rules are not followed.

It is important that all students are aware of the information available to them on the **Coos Bay School District 9 Web Site**. 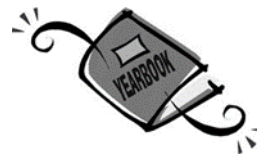
