A note from the nurse:

The Oregon Health Division will be requiring **all K–6th students** to have the **Hepatitis A** vaccinations starting with the **2014/15 school year**. If your child has not had these vaccinations please make sure that you get this taken care of.

The Oregon Health Division requires that all students entering the 7th grade have a Tdap dose. The Tdap must be given at or after the child's 7th birthday.
