When it's more than just a few students behaving poorly, it's really difficult to separate the students and it does always bother me a bit because it truly isn't fair. I've asked our students to share with me any ideas they may have by dropping a letter by my office. All of our 7th graders wrote me letters and I read all of them. After a morning meeting yesterday with our 7th graders and their teachers where students were thoughtful and honest as they talked, I asked the 7th graders if they would like to sit together and go to lunch a few minutes early to set a good example for our 6th graders. They all wanted to give it a shot. Well, I am so proud of our 7th grade class participating in solving the issue, then being fantastic role models by demonstrating the most appropriate and respectful behavior during lunch that I've seen all year. When our students behave so well, they dismiss themselves to recess and have a lot more independence at school. If your child is a 7th grader, please take a moment to thank them for their work this week and be proud of how they took a negative situation and turned it into something very positive.

We have a site council meeting on Monday in our library at 3:00 and all of our site council meetings are open to the public. We would really like to have more of our parents as regular members of our site council.
