Nurses Note:

Food Allergy Restriction Note:

If your child has a dietary restriction that is not self-managed (by parent/child), our food services department will need a medical note from the student's medical provider. This is a federal food services law.

Major Example: If your child has a milk allergy, they may forgo "selecting" a milk. If there is a medical note, a substitution will be made.

*Remember – in order to rescind the medical restriction, you will need to provide the nurse a stop order from the student's medical provider.
